 Naugahyde Fist Guards (Aka: Red; Shiro: White/Blue), Groin Protector (Males)

Highly Recommended (under 18): AAU Face shield

- <u>COMPETITOR DRESS CODE</u>: Traditional White Gi, No Jewelry/metal hair clips, Trimmed nails, No Glasses (athletic safety goggles may be worn), all mandatory kumite equipment, and appropriate belt representative of experience level (will be provided at each ring)
- BELTS: EACH OF THE 4 EXPERIENCE LEVELS ARE REPRESENTED BY ONE SPECIFIC COLOR:
 - *Beginner (Under 1-Year Training; White, Yellow, Orange): Solid White Belt
 - *Novice (1-2 Years Training; Blue, Green, Purple): Solid Green Belt
 - *Intermediate (2-4 Years Training; Brown): Solid Brown Belt
 - *Advanced (4+ Years Training; Black): Solid Black Belt
- <u>DIVISIONS</u>: For a positive competitor experience, any division with more than 16 athletes, may be split. The tournament director reserves the right to combine/split any division.

ORDER OF EVENTS: 8:45am National Anthem, Opening Ceremony
 9am All Kobudo, Team Kata, Adult Advanced, Inclusive Karate Divisions
 Followed by:

Individual Kata & Kumite Divisions Ages 5 – 17 Individual Kata & Kumite Divisions Ages 35 – 44 & 45+ Individual Kata & Kumite Divisions Ages 18 – 34 Male & Female Kata Grand Championship (Winners of Advanced Kata ages 16-17, 18-34, 35-44, & 45+)

RULES: Modified AAU Rules: Kata Flag System, Shobu Sanbon Kumite,
 Kobudo & Team Kata (Numerical Scoring)

KUMITE:

- SHOBU SANBON for all Divisions (Wazari: 1/2 point, Ippon: 1 full point)
- **DURATION OF MATCHES:** MATCHES ARE STOP TIME IN ALL DIVISIONS
 - All Divisions 2 minutes <u>Stop Time</u> EXCEPT 18 34 Advanced: 3 minutes
 - 3 Full Points (Combining Wazari & Ippon) wins bout
 - Ties decided in Enchosen (Extended match in which first score wins; 1-min.)
- SCORING: A full point (Ippon) is awarded for two techniques only:
 - (1) controlled kick to the head/face OR
 - (2) break of balance / safe takedown immediately followed by a scoring technique.
 - o All other permissible techniques to scoring areas will be awarded ½ Point (Wazari)

• PENALTY CATEGORIES:

- (A) Hansoku Prohibited actions and behaviors, including Contact & Non-Contact penalties
- (B) Mubobi defenseless behavior.
- (C) Shikkaku (disqualification or expulsion from the event/competition)
 - PENALTY LEVELS: Each Penalty Category listed above has 3 levels:
 - (1) Chukoku (warning), (2) Hansoku Chui (penalty), (3) Hansoku (disqualification)
- (D) JOGAI OUT OF BOUNDS; JOGAI HAS 4 PENALTY LEVELS:
 - (1) Jogai Ichi (Warning)
 - (2) Jogai Ni (Warning)
 - (3) Jogai Hansoku Chui (Penalty)
 - (4) Jogai Hansoku (Disqualification)
- FACE CONTACT: For all <u>BEGINNER/NOVICE DIVISIONS</u> (kick/hand technique):

Face contact is strictly prohibited and may be penalized.

If worn, a face-shield shall be considered the face. "Skin touch" without any transfer of energy (kick) to the side/back of head is permitted.

*For <u>INTERMEDIATE AND ADVANCED DIVISIONS</u> (kick/hand technique): "Skin Touch" is permitted, but transfer of energy to the face/head area is prohibited and will be penalized.

KATA:

- AGES 5 34 BEGINNER, NOVICE, INTERMEDIATE DIVISIONS: AAU FLAG SYSTEM (2 ROUNDS)
 - May Repeat (or change) Kata in each match. In round 1, competitors will come up 2 at a time performing kata simultaneously. The winner of Round 1 (undefeated) will be awarded 1st Place. The runner-up from Round 1 is guaranteed no less than 3rd Place. The same process will be repeated in Round 2. Then, the winner of Round 2 will compete against the runner-up from Round 1. The winner of that match is awarded 2nd Place and the loser is awarded 3rd Place. In this system, every competitor will have the opportunity to have, at least, two matches.
- Ages 35+ Beginner, Novice, Intermediate, Advanced: NUMERICAL SCORING
- AGES 18-34 ADVANCED: OPEN FLAG KATA; MUST CHANGE KATA EACH ROUND
- AGES 8-17 ADVANCED: FLAG SYSTEM (UTILIZING BRACKETS; SAME PROCEDURE AS KUMITE)
 - o MAY REPEAT (or change) KATA EACH ROUND
- AAU KATA RULES: Beginner: Must Perform Basic Kata ONLY

Novice: May Perform Basic/Intermediate Level Kata ONLY

Intermediate: May Perform any kata Advanced: May Perform any Kata

- **KATA GRAND CHAMPIONSHIPS**: ONE FREE KATA (NUMERICAL SCORING)
 - WINNERS OF MALE ADVANCED: 16-17, 18-34, 35-44, 45+
 - WINNERS OF FEMALE ADVANCED: 16-17, 18-34, 35-44, 45+

KOBUDO:

- ALL AGES & LEVELS: NUMERICAL SCORING SYSTEM
 - In the event of a tie, the competitors may perform the same Kobudo Kata, EXCEPT in an Advanced Division. To break a tie in an advanced division, the competitors must perform a different kata (it may be a different weapon).
 - o In a combined Intermediate and Advanced division, competitors may perform the same kata, in the event of a tie.

TEAM KATA:

- All three team members must start and end the Kata facing in the same direction and towards the Referee.
- They shall start and finish in a triangular formation.
- All three members shall perform the same kata.
- The performance must be synchronized.
- Utilizes the numerical scoring system. The winner will be the team with the highest total score.
- One round of competition shall determine the winners in team kata.
- Age of the <u>OLDEST</u> TEAM MEMBER determines the Team Participation Category.
- Team Members <u>MAY NOT</u> compete in multiple Team Participation Categories (Athletes may not participate on more than one team)
- All Teams May Combine Genders.
- If a Team Participation Category is further divided by Rank, it shall be determined by the team member with the highest belt/rank.

INCLUSIVE KARATE COMPETITION:

- At the discretion of the tournament director, Inclusive Division(s) will be divided by Inclusive Category, Age, Gender, &/or Experience Levels. To foster and promote competition, the tournament director may elect to forego dividing competitors by Category, Age, Gender, &/or Experience Levels. We may combine categories to create a competitive division.
- Competitors in this division may choose to compete in Kata and/or Kobudo.
